## Emergency Management Overview



### What is Emergency Management?



- Prepare for natural, technological, and man-made hazards
- Coordinate disaster response with Cal OES and FEMA
- Lead short- and long-term recovery efforts
- Identify mitigation actions to reduce the risk of future disasters

## 2026 Sonoma County Hazard Mitigation Plan

Mitigation planning happens <u>before</u> a disaster strikes. It results in safer, more resilient communities – reducing risk for the residents, businesses, and critical services in Sonoma County.



## Why Update?



#### The mitigation plan update will:

- Identify natural hazard risk and mitigation strategies
- Maintain eligibility for pre- and post-disaster mitigation funding from FEMA
- Since 1993, Sonoma County received \$90.7 million from FEMA for mitigation projects

- Public and stakeholder outreach
- Community Lifelines and Critical Facilities
- Socially vulnerable and underserved communities
- Climate change
- Mitigation actions for every hazard of concern

#### 2026 Plan Goals



- 1. Protect people and minimize loss of life and injury.
- 2. Minimize potential for loss of property, economic and social impacts, and displacement due to hazards.
- 3. Minimize potential for environmental impacts and consider a broad-range of mitigation strategies, including nature-based solutions where feasible.
- 4. Communicate and improve public understanding of natural hazard risk to the whole community within Sonoma County.
- 5. Support the advancement of effective mitigation policies, programs, and projects that are adaptive, proactive, cost-effective, and environmentally sustainable to build a resilient Sonoma County.
- 6. Enhance the capability/capacity of the Sonoma County planning area to prepare, respond, and recover from the impact of natural hazards.





# **Community Rating System**

The Community Rating System (CRS) is a voluntary incentive program that recognizes and encourages community floodplain management practices that exceed the minimum requirements of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).



## **NFIP Community Rating System**



- Voluntary incentive program that rewards floodplain management practices
- Communities awarded points Class 1 to Class 10
- Similar to ISO fire rating
- Lower CRS class = higher discounts on flood insurance
- The HMP is an eligible floodplain management practice worth 385 CRS points





#### **CRS 10-Step Process**



- Organize to Prepare the Plan
- Involve the Public
- Coordinate with Other Agencies
- Assess the Hazards
- Assess the Problem
- Set Goals
- Review Possible Activities
- Draft an Action Plan
- Adopt the Plan
- Implement, Evaluate, and Revise






## **CRS Participating Communities**

  - Class 6 community
  - 20% discount on flood insurance

A well-defined public participation process is <u>essential</u> to the success of Sonoma County's HMP Update.




## **Public Hazard Mitigation Survey**








#### **Review Draft Plan**

- Keep an eye on the DEM website and social media for updates









