Human Resources Director, Janell Crane, had no report to make at this meeting.

IV. AGENDA ITEMS

A. Vacancy Rate Update

Presented by Spencer Keywood, Deputy Human Resources Director.

Deputy Director Keywood presented the County vacancy rate is currently at 9.04%, down from the 12% reported by then-Recruitment and Classification Manager, Jennifer Lelouarn during the annual Workload Summary Report presentation in December 2023. His

memo included the department-wide vacancy rates comparison from December 2022, January 2024, and June 2024. Commissioner Dunn requested Human Resources staff provide division-level vacancy rates in addition to the department-level vacancy at the next annual report.

B. Sheriff's Office Recruitment Status

Presented by Eddie Engram, Sheriff-Coroner.

Sheriff Engram shared with the Commission information about his Office's hiring process, the recent decrease in the vacancy rate, and current recruitment efforts. He also responded to the questions from the Commission regarding the mandatory overtime, DEI outreach, and recruitment difficulties.

A public comment on this item was made by Travis Balzarini, SEIU 1021 President.

C. Park Ranger Update

Presented by Janell Crane, Human Resources Director.

The second reading of the ordinance changing the designation of Park Rangers from Peace Officers to Public Officers, was approved by the Board on July 16, 2024. The ordinance will go into effect 30 days after the second reading. Human Resources is still in active meet-and-confer with SEIU and SCLEA.

At the last Commission meeting, the Chair indicated she would have a conversation with the Commission's outside counsel, Mr. Jeff Walter. That meeting took place. Chair Sabo stated that the Commission received a confidential report from Counsel the morning of the Commission meeting. Most of the Commission members have not yet reviewed the report. Chair Sabo suggested this matter be placed on the agenda at the next meeting, check with Counsel to determine if the matter could be discussed in closed session, or that she and Commissioner Withington form a sub-committee and meet with Mr. Walter. Commissioner Withington suggested the Commission Counsel attend the next meeting to answer any questions that arise, as he was not sure the matter would meet the requirements for closed session. The Commission discussed the importance of following-up on this matter

even though the ordinance has already been approved. Human Resources will work with Chair Sabo on applicable next steps.
