The new HEART program manager, Chris Inclan, was introduced and presented slides with information about efforts to integrate HEART into the subregional street outreach report.

- Lead Agency Evaluation: Michael Gause offered insight from comparisons with other Continuum of Care charters and policies with regard to Lead Agency evaluations, as well as monitoring guidance from the Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD).
- Homeless Memorial Day: Friday, December 20, 2024, 11:00 AM 12:30 PM, at the Arlene Francis Center, 99 6th St., Santa Rosa
- SoCo Homeless Coalition 2025 Elections: Karissa White presented an update on the recent Homeless Coalition elections, and announced the successful candidates for the following seats:
 - Homeless Advocacy seat Dannielle Danforth, West County Community Services
 - Adult Lived Experience seat Chessy Etheridge, Lived Experience Advisory Planning (LEAP) Board.

The Board was asked for recommendations regarding how to proceed with filling the following two vacant seats for which no nominations were received:

- Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC) Led/Serving Organization seat
- Transition Aged Youth (TAY) Lived Experience seat

With: "Coalition Staff, as the Lead Agency, shall consult with counsel if questions arise at the Board, if needed.

- **B.** If the TAY Lived Experience seat cannot be filled, the Lived Experience Advisory Planning Board (LEAP) Board can appoint an individual with lived experience to remain seated until that seat is filled.
- **C.** Expand the age limit for nominations to the TAY Lived Experience seat from 18-24 to 18-30.
- **D.** Continue to have a LEAP Board representative on the Board as a non-voting member.

At the previous meeting, Coalition Board members and others asked for the Lead Agency staff to follow up on specific items. Staff summarized responses to present at the February Sonoma County Homeless Coalition Board meeting.

Discussion

At the previous meeting, Coalition Board members and others asked for the Lead Agency staff to follow up on the following questions or comments:

- Update for TAY Lived Experience and BIPOC Seat: Staff have met with the Chair of the
 Homeless Coalition Board and confirmed the extended nomination period for these seats will be
 open for a three-week period. Staff are currently working on updating the nomination and
 statement of interest forms and creating a timeline. This information will be released and
 shared widely once ready. We encourage current Board members to share this information with
 anyone they believe would be interested in filling these seats.
- 2. SoCo Homeless Coalition Conflict of Interest Forms: Per the Sonoma County Homeless Coalition Governance Charter, all members of the Coalition Board or relevant Committee have a duty to disclose potential conflicts of interest. As such, each Board member or relevant Committee member will sign a Conflict-of-Interest statement each calendar year using the template form produced by Coalition staff. Members who find themselves faced with a potential conflict between their business, organizational or private interests, and their Coalition responsibilities shall avoid conflict of interest during the decision-making process by following the guidelines for disclosure and recusal listed within the Charter. Coalition staff member Jynessa Lazzaroni will follow up with each Board member individually to collect executed forms.

- 3. **Homeless Coalition Board Meeting Schedule:** A poll was sent out to Homeless Coalition Board members in December 2024 to decide the best monthly meeting schedule for 2025. The majority of Homeless Coalition board members who voted selected to keep the previous meeting schedule of meeting on the 4th Wednesday of each month from 1:00 4:30pm (with the exception of holidays).

- 1. Introduction of New Staff Member: We would like to introduce the Department of Health Service's newest team member, Jynessa Lazzaroni. She has been hired for the position of Community Development Program Specialist and will be supporting the Homeless Coalition on various projects reporting to Karissa White, Continuum of Care Coordinator. Jynessa will be reaching out this week to collect the annual board and committee member Conflict of Interest forms. Please ensure these forms are completed as quickly as possible.
- 2. Appointed Licensed Health Care Organization Seat: Benjamin Leroi with Santa Rosa Community Health informed staff that he will no longer be able to participate on the Homeless Coalition Board. He has submitted his resignation for the remainder of his two-year term, with one year remaining. As we have an open seat on the Homeless Coalition Board, we are asking for your assistance in identifying a qualified healthcare provider to fill the position for the remainder of the term, as outlined in our Governance Charter. The individual appointed must be affiliated with a licensed healthcare organization.

Per the Homeless Coalition Governance Charter: In the event of a vacancy of an elected member, the members of the Coalition Board will elect a successor to hold the seat for the remainder of the vacated seat's term.

Recommendation:

Homeless Coalition Board members appoint an individual that qualifies to fill this seat for the remainder of the term. Board members may reach out to potential candidates ahead of the upcoming meeting to gauge their interest in participating.

OVERVIEW

The Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) were discussed at the December 2024 Homeless Coalition Board meeting. During that meeting, staff took feedback from Board members for both the Lead Agency and Collaborative Applicant MOUs. Once Counsel has completed their review, both MOUs will come back to the Homeless Coalition, most likely in February 2025. SUMMARY

The Sonoma County Homeless Coalition Board will hold elections for the 2025 Board Chair and Vice Chair positions during the January 22, 2025, Coalition Board meeting. According to the Homeless Coalition Governance Charter:

- 1) Seated Board members shall select by a simple majority vote a Chair and Vice Chair for one-year terms at the first meeting of the Board each calendar year.
- 2) The Chair and Vice Chair positions cannot both be held by homeless services providers.
- 3) The Chair conducts Coalition Board meetings. The Vice Chair serves in the Chair's absence. Any member of the Coalition Board may be elected as Coalition Board Chair or Vice-Chair.
- 4) Terms: Officers shall serve for one-year terms.
- 5) Term limits: There will be no term limits for Officer positions; indefinite reelection is permissible provided that the persons serving as Chair or Vice Chair remain on the Board as elected or appointed by their appointing organization or agency.

The election will require a nomination, second, and majority vote. The vote will be held publicly.

RECOMMENDED ACTION(S)

ACTION ITEM: Elect 2025 HC Board Chair ACTION ITEM: Elect 2025 HC Board Vice-Chair

DISCUSSION

The Chair and Vice Chair positions require a minimum of 5-8 hours per month, excluding the 4-hour monthly Board meeting and Committee commitments. Prospective Board Officers need to ensure they have the capacity to fill these positions prior to nomination. In addition to strong facilitation skills, responsiveness and punctuality are vital to the success of these roles.
